The World of Minerology Loses a Legend

1940-2015

On September 25, 2015, the world of Minerology lost a true legend. Rock Currier (Yes, Rock was his birth name. Named similar to Rock Hudson) passed away at his home in California. Some of you may not know Rock, but for those who did know him, are aware of his great contributions to the hobby, in his documentation of many rare and unknown species around the world, to his write ups of localities all over the globe. He was the owner of a large importing company in California, Jewel Tunnel Imports, which is arguably the largest wholesaler of mineral-related items in the United States. He was an avid collector, and had a knowledge of minerals and localities without equal among his peers.

Rock was instrumental in opening up the world market to the incredible zeolites of India during the 1970's. Rock was a fixture at the Springfield Show, where I first met him. His minerals were incredible. The specimens of your dreams. He wrote for Rocks & Minerals Magazine, The Mineralogical Record, and Mineral News. He was the former director of the Hudson Institute of Mineralogy. But today's collectors will best know Rock as a managing partner, and major contributor of MinDat. Rock made many, many contributions to MinDat in the years since its formation, and communicated with anyone who asked, and gave easy to understand and sometimes humorous information to get his point across. He firmly believed in the mission of educating and enlightening the world about his beloved hobby of

Mineralogy and Mineral Collecting. His humor and kindness stand out in the hobby. The few times I communicated with him, he was always cordial and open to my willingness to learn more. He will be missed. The attached photo is of Rock collecting in an African desert, doing what he did best.

**National Limestone Quarries Field Trip Report**

It was another beautiful fall Saturday on October 17th, and 29 members of NoJMS and a couple guests from NJ Friends of Mineralogy, (setting the all time record for a field trip at National Limestone) drove 3 hours to attend our annual field trip to central Pennsylvania, to visit National Limestone Quarries. Again, Eric Stahl, the owner of Nat'l Limestone, opened his 2 quarries to our members, allowing us to explore and collect the amazing minerals contained within. As the members congregated in the main office, Eric spoke with us, with his annual sermon, and then we were free to traverse the quarries, looking for minerals and fossils.

At the Middleburg quarry, members were treated to very nice specimens of fluorite, superb calcite formations, including some of the largest and nicest crystals we have seen from this location, and of course, the cave flowstone(travertine), which made lots of members very happy. One junior member even found an intact stalactite, in amazingly good condition! We even stayed an extra hour because the collecting was so extraordinary!

We then moved on to the Mt. Pleasant Mills quarry, and immediately we were finding strontianite specimens from a fresh rockfall in the main pit. Many fine calcite crystals were also found, as well as some fluorites. Then,

a group moved to the top of the mountain, and collected some very nice wavelite and fossil specimens.

Afterward, came the highlight of the trip (as if it couldn't get any better!), we headed to Mifflinburg to visit Jim Van Fleet and his family, to enjoy another wonderful bar-b-que, some fine pies from Ard's Farms, a tour of Jim's amazing fluorescent collection, and some fun garage fluorescent collecting!!

A GREAT BIG THANK YOU goes out to Jim and Eric for their hospitality and friendship, and for opening their homes and properties to our members.

The day was wonderful, and was one of our BEST field trips ever! Everyone had a great time, and went home with carloads of rocks!!!

MINUTES OF THE 717th NoJMS MEETING

The meeting was called to order by Jeff Wilson, the president, on Thursday, October 8, 2015.

A review of the scheduled anticipated events was announced.

Ron Schulz revealed Jesse Jacobson's suggested addition of another swap to the calendar. Deep in the icy days of winter the enclosed pavilion at Sterling Hill would house an event for camaraderie and the trading of gems and minerals.

Arlene Castleman, the treasurer, stated that there is a healthy balance between the club's expenditures and income. She encouraged the payment of the annual dues.

Steve Okulewicz, a geology professor at Hofstra University, presented "Geology and Mineralogy of Staten Island." Staten Island, one of the five New York City Boroughs, surprisingly has the highest point of elevation along the Atlantic seaboard, south of Maine. Its 102.5 square miles comprises 58.5 square miles of land and 44.0 square miles of water. The strata of bedrock is approximately 430 million years old, which is predominantly serpentine minerals, containing mostly the antigorite variety, chrysotile and lizardite. The lecture delineated the types of minerals and their sites.

The presentation was informative, filled with data, lively and accompanied by visual aids. It was a pleasure to experience this animated recitation and we thank Professor Okulewicz.

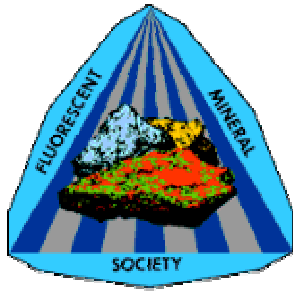
